THE HOLLISTS OF LODSWORTH (PART 2)

Continued from last the last issue

In 1804, Anthony Capron (1762-1836) bought the red-brick mansion in the High Street in Midhurst now known as Capron House and it seems that The Moor was sold. By this time, he was indisputably wealthy, describing himself as 'gentleman' and he probably lived in Midhurst until his death in 1812. It is not clear how he made his money; it is suggested that he was a barrister, although no records of any legal work have been found and this does not fit with him living and farming at West Tarring near Worthing.

On his father's death, his son Anthony, who had married Margaret Hasler lived in some style at Capron House with carriages and all the appurtenances of the gentry. In 1817, his mother's half-brother Peter Vincent died. Peter had been a successful tallow chandler at Chandos Street, Covent Garden. He had one surviving unmarried daughter, and having made ample provision for her he left the residue of his estate equally between three of his nephews, one of whom was Anthony. Anthony became a JP at Midhurst and was seemingly involved in the law and was undoubtedly a close acquaintance and adviser of Elizabeth Hollist who was fifteen years the elder.

It was in this satisfactory position that Anthony Capron inherited the Hollist estates and, in accordance with Elizabeth's will, changed his name to Hollist and agreed to take the arms of Hollist in place of the arms of Capron, but he was aged seventy-one and died three years later so it was his son, now Hasler Capron Hollist who became the prominent figure in Lodsworth until his death in 1874. (He was not technically the lord of the manor as this was the owner of Cowdray House). He had become a successful barrister in London and in 1825 married Frances Georgiana Ommanney (1802-1881) at St Clement Danes. She was the

daughter of Sir Francis Molyneux Ommanney (1774-1840) and his wife Georgiana Frances Hawkes (1776-1854). Sir Francis was a member of a Huguenot family who claimed descent from Charlemagne and was knighted in 1820 after serving as MP for Barnstaple in Devon. Arms were produced which halved the new Hollist arms with those of Ommanney and it is these that now swing on the signboard of the Hollist Arms Public House.

Hasler and Frances built Lodsworth House designed by Edward Blore in 1837-38, and, like his father, Hasler became a JP and Deputy Lieutenant for Sussex. They had twelve children, of whom six died in infancy and two, George (1838-1864) and Marion Beatrice

(1848-1885), did not marry. Of the four who did so, Elizabeth May (known as Lily) (1839-1899) and Agnes Ash (1841-1926) had no children. Margaret Anne

Capron Hollist (1837-1926) married her cousin Frederick Francis Ommanney and they had several children. In 1865, her brother, Edward Ommanney Capron Hollist (1838-1924) married Ellen Lydia Richarda Wetherell (1843-1915) and inherited Lodsworth House on his father's death in 1874. He rose to Lieutenant Colonel in the Royal Artillery, becoming

a JP and Deputy Lieutenant for Sussex. Edward and Ellen had two sons and three daughters. Their elder son, Anthony May Capron Hollist (1873-1915) was killed in action in WW1, but he had married Katharine Barker by whom he had two daughters, Susan and Lucy. The younger son Gerald Wetherell Capron Hollist (1877-1922) married Ruby Hodgson in 1904 but died in 1922. They had two sons, Archibald May and Edward Gerald and a daughter Pamela who all married but had no further connection with Lodsworth. Edward and Ellen had three daughters. May Capron Hollist (1867-1947) was an invalid but became an accomplished watercolourist and was on the Council of the Girl Guides. Neither she nor her sister Ella Capron Hollist (1872-1891) married. Nevertheless, their sister, Lillian Capron Hollist (1869-1942) married Herbert Cooper Barnes (d. 1918) and they had a son, Cecil Hollist Barnes (1903-1788) and daughter, Audrey Barnes (b. 1902). Cecil married his cousin Susan Hollist in 1938 and their children have inherited what remains of the Hollist estate. Nevertheless, Lodsworth House and most other properties were sold in 1926 following the death of Edward Hollist and both of his sons.

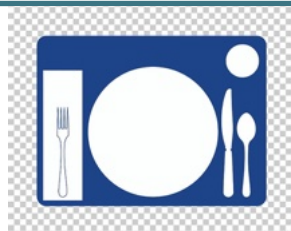

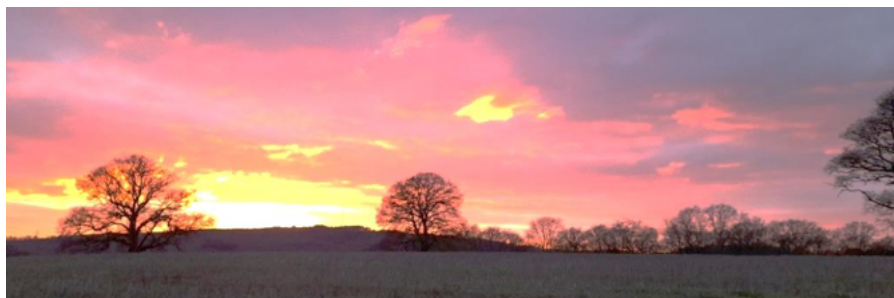
Our heritage really *does* matter

The estates sold off their tenants' homes, and many families who had lived here for generations were forced to move away. But, there remained a strong community spirit, and villagers came together in the church, in the pub, on the village green, in the shop and at the village hall.

How lucky we are to live in such a lovely parish! It is steeped in history, and its heritage belongs to *everyone* who lives here – now as well as in the past. Did you know...?

In 1624 – 400 years ago – a baby named John Boxold was baptised in the church. His family name became Boxall over the years. There are still Boxalls in Lurgashall today.

In 1724 – 300 years ago – a descendant of baby John, John Boxall, married Susan Hugh; and Elizabeth Caplin married Peter Bridger. There is a house called Caplins in Hillgrove where a branch of the family lived for many generations, and in Windfallwood, the Cottage at the back of Keepers Cottage was lived in by Cecily Caplin until her death in 1991.

In 1844 – 180 years ago - Lurgashall Church of England School was opened in August 1844 by the “National Society for promoting the Education of the Poor in the principles of the Established Church”, and it was closed in July 1951 “with solemn prayer by me, the Rev. E.T. Stealey”.

In 1874 – 150 years ago – the rector was Septimus Fairles, the pub was run by Sidney Callingham, Frederick Platt lived at Blackdown House, Mrs Ann Goble was the farmer at Ramsfold, James Lickfold was the wheelwright at Hillgrove, William Payne farmed Greengate, Frederick Farthing ran the shop and Post Office and the schoolmaster was Alfred Ball.

In 1924 – 100 years ago – these were some of the children who started at Lurgashall School: Ivy Lilian Hall of Bishops Cottages; Florence Boxall of Windfallwood; Leslie Dabbs of the Noah’s Ark; Gordon & Jack Rudderham of Sods Cottage; Alice Bicknell of Roundhurst.

In 1974 – 50 years ago – the Weald & Downland Museum began the painstaking job of dismantling Lurgashall Mill from its site by the mill pond and transferring it to the museum where it was carefully reassembled. The work took three years.

In 1984 – 40 years ago – The Lurgashall Players put on the hugely successful ‘Goodnight Mrs Puffin’ at the village hall. Two of the starring thespians, Francis Dillon-Thiselton and Jacquie Lawson, still grace our village today!

Doreen Haines, née Bicknell

August 1924 – December 2023

Doreen Haines, née Bicknell, loved Lurgashall, the village where she grew up. Born in Brighton in 1924, her family moved the next year to live in Lurgashall.

The Bicknell family have been in the parish for over 150 years – first at Windfallwood, then spreading out to Ebernoe, Colhook, Northchapel, Hillgrove and Lurgashall itself.

Doreen grew up at Crossways (the house by the cross-roads on the way out towards the main road to Petworth). Her father was chauffeur to the owner of Burroughsmere (now Moses) on the lane up to Hillgrove, and later he worked as a driver for the Admiralty.

Doreen was the third of six siblings, and at the great age of 99, she outlived them all, including her youngest brother Stan Bicknell who lived in Lodsworth until his death just last year, aged 89.

Doreen and her siblings all attended Lurgashall School, and she kindly shared with the Lurgashall Archive her many happy memories of being at the school.

Marriage took Doreen away from Lurgashall, and after a spell in Easebourne, she and her husband Archibald Haines eventually settled in Horsham. In later life Doreen would often come back to Lurgashall to visit, especially on fête day. What a lovely lady! Rest in peace, Doreen.

THE AULD FOOL - ON THE MATTER OF SCRUTCHBUTTOCKS AND DUSTERS

‘Scrutchbuttocks and Dusters’ are lurking in the shrubs and bushes of our garden at Whites Green – my long-gone grandfather ‘Busty’ Harris who came out of Romney Marsh - had a fine descriptive turn of phrase – with a number of words which as a youngster I thought were real, but now realize that he probably made them up.

He was referring of course to the scruffy looking versions of our garden birds which can sometimes be glimpsed in the winter foliage. They seem almost ashamed of their appearance and are certainly more camera shy than their springtime showy selves. I’m not sure that the



two pictures are of the same robin, but they are almost certainly from the same brood – using the same territory and having the same habits - but they were taken months apart. The big difference is the moult or molt - feathers have to be replaced as believe it or not they do wear out, and new ones have to be grown – the colours become less saturated and the quality of the dress generally more ‘scruffy’.

Of course it is not a feature confined to Robins – keep an eye out and you'll notice yellowy/grey Blue Tits – speckled Blackbirds – and flutterings of birds who look as if they have just collected their latest clothes from the Church Jumble Sale.



It'll pass and we'll soon have them back to feathery best - trust me 'Scrutchbuttocks and Dusters' are a transient stage – they'll soon be back to their best again.....

Mind you it is not confined to birds – this winterdrabbery thing – The Badger (AKA Mrs C) has a mission of many years standing to relieve me of my ancient waxed jacket – referred to by me as my "Barbour" – which it patently is not - it is a far cheaper version of this well-known countryman's favourite and is some thirty odd years of

age and even then came second-hand.

The wind however would not dare to squeeze between the wax clogged pores of its cloth and the rain still runs off the surface in a very satisfying way.....

Sartorial elegance does not feature much in the Southern reaches of our parish.....
